Classmate Hazel Tharpe Willett's Husband Had Two Great Ideas

In 1942, Thurman Willett, a young school administrator in southeast Missouri, watched high school seniors walk across the stage to receive their graduation diplomas.

He realized that not one of them would go on to college and was disturbed over the waste of talent, knowing that some could improve their chances of success if they had the opportunity to learn a skill.

Thus Linn State Technical College was born.

Later, in 1961, Willett, then superintendent of schools for the Linn R-II School District, watched as the first class in electronics was held.

The college celebrated its 50th anniversary in September with a celebration and a monument dedication. More than 10,000 students have graduated and there are now three campuses, the main one in Linn and satellite campuses in Jefferson City and Mexico, MO.

The gymnasium at Linn High School is named the Thurman L. Willett Field House.

But, Willett's best idea came in 1955 when he married Hazel Tharpe, a 1943 graduate of Hickman High School.

He and Hazel had three sons. Willett died in 1991.

She has four grandchildren and two step-grandchildren.

Hazel is still employed full time as administrative assistant to Missouri State Representative Joe Aull.

She, at the same age as other '43 Kewpies, still enjoys traveling, especially to see grandchildren. She also like to read and tend her flowers.

Editor's Note: The monument, sculpted by Sabra Tull Meyer, a '45 Kewpie, is located in the roundabout of the main campus and features an eagle leaving the nest and taking flight.

JAY ELLIOTT and wife, Dorothy, spent three weeks this summer using up time-share options in Michigan, Wisconsin and in Tennessee.

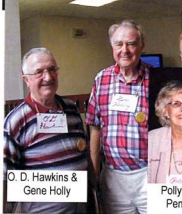
