

#### Other Business:

- Janet Lasley made a motion that we donated \$200.00 to the local Urban Agriculture organization. **The motion was seconded and passed.**
- Marsha Taylor and Leigh Speichinger will look into the Farmer's Market project, to build a permanent structure for the market.

#### State Convention:

Fourteen members attended the FGCM State Convention in Hannibal May 1-4, either full or part-time, to see our own Karen Blackmore installed as State President. Our club hosted a reception for her after her installation by NGC President Sandra Robinson. The reception went very well, our thanks to the committee Carolyn Adams, Marie Pasley, Alice Havard, Marsha Taylor and others. The club received a thank-you note from Karen for the reception and our support. Our club received a refund of \$250.00 for sponsoring a tree in this park, in honor of Ken and Jane Sadler. This was from the president's project of native tree-planting. And our flower show of last year won a state award of \$50.00, and has been forwarded to National. And Carolyn Doyle was given the Award of Honor for this year, which came with a lovely tiara, which she showed off at this meeting!
