### **Minutes CMDS Meeting, February 12, 2023**

The day's presentation began with Patti Waterman introducing John Poehlmann, who in turn introduced Terry Woods, Research Specialist from the University of Missouri and our speaker for today's presentation "Bugs in the Garden". Terry provided documentation for some common garden and daylily insect pests and discussed some of his personal experiences with particular insect species. Various club members also mentioned their experiences in what was an interactive presentation.

After Terry's presentation, the day's formal club meeting began with President Debbie Nix discussing renewal of the club's Nursery Dealer Registration. It was decided that because our plant sales in 2022 were below \$2000, Debbie would renew the registration at the lower "Restricted Nursery Dealer" rate.

The next topic involved the upcoming visit this summer by members of the Flint Hills Daylily Society in Manhattan, Kansas. Without a Summer Meeting occurring in Region 11 this year, they have decided to travel to Missouri and visit several Region 11 gardens, including some of our club members' gardens. On the evening of June 29th, the club is planning to host the group for dinner. At this point, the topic was brought up mainly to let club members know this was happening; additional discussions will likely be held as the date approaches.

Next up, John Poehlmann provided the Treasurers' Report. Afterwards, he proposed a motion to invest a portion of the club's funds in CDs with Edward Jones, to have those funds generate some additional funding for the club while being held. The motion was brought and passed.

Lastly, the question was raised concerning the date for this year's flower show. As of the meeting, no date had yet been set.

### **Treasurer and Membership Report**

The Central Missouri Daylily Club had a \$12,619.55 balance at our February 12, 2023 meeting. Two expenses in February included \$75.00 to Terry Woods who spoke at the February meeting and Norma Mountjoy of \$58.39 for hospitality supplies gave us a balance of \$12,486.16 February 28. March 9<sup>th</sup> \$5,000 was invested in a CD with Edward Jones at 4.8%, leaving a bank balance of \$7,486.16. A second \$5,000 CD is planned to be invested in April.

As of March 17, we have 35 active members.
