Overlooked Cultivars

Every year, my committee works to ensure that any potential "Overlooked Cultivars" are considered for the garden judge's ballot. The following are the criteria that we must consider:

The Awards & Honors Committee may add up to 10 additional cultivars, which may have been previously overlooked, to the Honorable Mention (HM) portion of the ballot.

- · Cultivars of deceased hybridizers may be considered if family members or appointed designee are not nominating in their name.
- · Cultivars from living, active hybridizers are not eligible.
- · Cultivars from living, inactive hybridizers who have not registered a daylily in at least 10 years are eligible, however, the Awards Chair should make every effort to contact them for permission.

Once an overlooked cultivar is added to the HM ballot, it is subject to the same eligibility guidelines as if the cultivar had been nominated by the hybridizers themselves but must be approved each year by the committee.

Minutes CMDC Meeting, October 10, 2022

The meeting was called to order by President, Debbie Nix. A treasurer's report was presented by John Poehlmann.

Debbie announced that no nominating committee had been needed as all members had agreed to serve another year. Debbie asked for any additional volunteers for those positions. None were voiced. There was a round of applause for those nominated. Carol Schultz moved and John Poehlmann seconded that we accept the offered slate by that acclimation.

Patti Waterman asked for suggested speakers for our meetings next year. John Poehlmann will contact a retired local entomologist as a possible speaker. Forward any additional ideas to Patti.

Region 11 has in recent years asked clubs to donate baskets to the summer regional meeting as a fundraiser. Several participants from our club saw much effort put into preparing baskets that received few bids and sold for much less than the donated value. There was discussion of the pros and cons of this activity and whether interest was waning. It was proposed that clubs might donate funds in lieu of presenting a basket. Region 11 President Carol Schultz was present and will take all this into consideration as future regional plans are made.

Carol Schultz announced that the Region 11 Winter Gathering will become the Spring Fling in 2023. It will be a similar format, held March 24-26, 2023 in Joplin, MO. This was the original location and somewhat more central for all clubs than Kansas City was. Regeneration will be a theme. James Gossard will be the featured hybridizer speaker. A panel discussion will feature: Karen Sherrill on the topic of selling her business to a younger daylily enthusiast; Julie Aikins of Chanute, KS will provide perspective on the early history of our region, its importance to the young the American Hemerocallis Society and its historic gardens; and Michael Kowalchyk will present a program on the passion for daylilies that he received from his grandmother as well as his program's vision for the future of daylilies. It is hoped visitors from outside the region will attend.

Carol also reiterated that there will be no region 11 summer meeting in 2023. The ADS national meeting will be in nearby Nashville, TN in mid-June. And the 2024 ADS national meeting will be hosted by Region 11 in Oklahoma City, OK.
