#### Minutes CMDS Meeting, April 2, 2023

The main presentation for the day was given by Bobby Scott of Topguns Daylily Garden in Yukon, OK. He showed dozens of slides of his latest and greatest seedlings. He noted several that will be future registrations. The seedlings were grouped by areas of focus, such as eye patterning, unusual forms, blue daylilies, etc. While he is currently focuses on many areas, he indicated that he is planning to narrow his focus to fewer paths as he goes forward. After the main presentation, he did a brief Q&A, answering club members' questions and having general conversation with the group.

After Bobby's presentation, the club meeting began. The following topics were covered during the meeting:

- John Poehlmann presented the Treasures Report.
- The recently held Spring Fling for Region 11 was discussed. CDMC was one of the better represented clubs at the event.
- Patti Waterman brought the Mavis Smith Service Award for the club to see. Patti was presented with this year's award at the Spring Fling.
- There was mention of a new commercial garden in Centralia: Cow Patty Blossoms.
- It was noted that there will not be a daylily exhibition at the Missouri State Fair this year.
- The next club meeting in June will be the flower show preparation meeting. Also being considered was having an officers' meeting the same day, to review club bylaws.
- To prepare for reviewing bylaws, John Wieland agreed to review past membership handbooks, to determine if any bylaws have been dropped over the years.
- The club's Spring Plant Sale was discussed, with the need expressed for volunteers. It was also
  mentioned that bringing photos of the plants helps to sell them, as buyers know exactly what
  they are getting.
- Lastly, the group from the Flint Hills Daylily Society, that was planning to visit Missouri this summer, is no longer planning to take the trip. It was noted, however, that Christopher Renner, FHDS member and MoKanOk editor, may visit on his own, and would likely plan his trip directly with the garden owners.

#### **Treasurer and Membership Report**

The May 13, 2023 Daylily Sale net income is \$695.50. Sales at the Columbia Farmers Market amounted to \$478.50 with a \$75 booth charge paid from cash; Sales at the Columbia Mall brought in \$317 with a \$25 booth charge. Daylily stock was sold for \$5, \$7 and \$10 depending on their date of release.

March 17 checking account balance was \$7,486.16. Expenditures included costs for Bobby Scott's presentation \$867.65, Hospitality expenses of \$183.62 and startup cash for the sale \$200. Income includes \$15 in dues and \$0.87 from a test of the Square used during the sale. Pending deposits include \$552.50 from sales plus \$200 returning startup cash. Combined, this will give us a \$2,003.26 balance circa May 17.

Our club holds two Certificate of Deposits with Edward Jones \$5,000 each with one maturing June 15 at 4.8% and the second maturing October 16 at 4.9%.

As of May 14, we have 38 active members and the great news is that several individuals at the sale asked when our next meeting is (and gave their name & email).
