Minutes CMDS Meeting, June 11, 2023

Carol Schultz kicked off the meeting with a presentation of ways to transport daylilies to an exhibition show without damaging them in route. She additionally suggested researching other regional publications for ideas on flower show submissions. Finally, she showed online videos from the Herrington family, parodying various exhibition show rules and procedures.

Alice Havard was next up, presenting details for the club's upcoming July 8th exhibition show. There was a need for a new Classifications Chair for the show; John Wieland volunteered to take that position. All other show chairs remain the same as last year. Four design types will be displayed at the show, in conjunction with the Columbia Garden Club. Alice presented an example of a possible design for the show, a picnic tray design. She asked for volunteers to sign up to take on the designs for the show.

Lastly, President Debbie Nix kicked off the club business portion of the meeting. John Poehlmann gave the Treasurers report, mentioning that a donation had been made to the ADS Endowment Fund in honor of Dorothy Anderson, a charter member of the club who had recently passed away. Nancy Rold mentioned the need for a nominating committee for the nomination of the club's officers for next year. And John Wieland mentioned that he is in the *Region 11* nominating committee, and if anyone in the club was interested in running for Region 11 President to contact him.

Treasurer and Membership Report

Beginning balance June 10, 2023 was \$1,961.46. Expenses included \$25 for Dorothy Anderson Memorial; \$100 to C Blakemore for projection equipment, \$20.92 to C Larkin for Hospitality expenses and \$13.20 to J Poehlmann for stamps. Dues from two members totaled \$30 in deposit.

The July 10 show expenses at the Columbia Public Library totaled \$1,531.51 composed of \$384.10 Hotel expenses; \$1,013.94 mileage and \$133.47 in meals.

August sales income netted \$980,23 derived from gross deposits of \$177 in sales at the club picnic on the 18th and \$1,103.23 total from Saturday August 19 sales at the Mall and Columbia Farmers Market.

From the gross sales were expenses of \$200 for startup cash, \$25 for booth rent at the Mall and \$75 for booth rent at the Columbia Farmers Market.

Current cash balance in our Central Bank checking account is \$1,281.06

Our club holds two Certificates of Deposit with Edward Jones. A \$5,000 CD at 4.9% matures in October and a second CD of \$4,000 at 5.35% matures in December. We also have \$1,062.51 in a cash position with Edward Jones at 1%.
